







- X High Fever
- X Loss of appetite and weight loss, weakness, lack of movement, sleepiness
- X Abortion in pregnant sows



- X Death of many pigs (Within 7-10 days)
- X Sudden death: Most times pigs can die suddenly without showing any signs at all





- X Bleeding from skin, snout, mouth
- X Nasal discharge, difficulty in breathing
